



Developing lessons beyond the trip

Technology:

ask your pupils to take responsibility for uploading content to the school blog or website, sharing their experiences with the rest of the school and parents

Art:

ask your pupils to develop a classroom or corridor display that brings to life their trip for the rest of the school

Creative Writing:

develop pupil's journalistic writing style by asking them to write a review of the trip once you return

Public Speaking:

ask your pupils to host an assembly once they return, sharing their experiences and demonstrating what they have learnt

Build Confidence:

suggest that your pupils pitch an article to a local paper which might be interested in running a feature on the trip

Acting & Script Writing:

put on a play which tells a story about their destination. This could be a great idea for bringing the history or culture of a destination to life

Desk Research:

encourage pupils to hone their research skills by setting a challenge to find famous people linked with their destination

Languages:

challenge your pupils to write an account of their trip in the relevant local language

Film & Media:

have pupils develop a short film or news story about their trip. This could feature on the school website or blog

Debating Skills:

pupils could report back to the Headteacher and Governors on their trip, debating for and against similar trips in the future
